As usual with everything, don't listen to all of the nonsense on the floor about why this may have happened; we have some very creative imaginations on the floor and some people who just like to start stories and drama.

I can't preach swiping to correct operation numbers enough. If you are not on the correct operation number then your area is not getting the credit for the manpower and hours associated with performing that function. Do NOT entrust management with saving your jobs; most of them can't even perform their own responsibilities. Every time that you switch to a different work area, you should be swiping to the operation number that is associated with that area. This all also ties in with not performing the work of other bid holders. You are helping to do away with jobs and when the axman comes it may be your position that leaves the building. Stop doing other people's bids! Stop getting on powered equipment when you are not an assigned level 5! Stop allowing seniority to be bypassed, it's one of our few rights! You are helping higher management relook at jobs, you are not helping your own cause.

There is still no news as a result of the review that our Plant is under. When we hear something, you will see something.

Manual bids for the current round of job bids closes at 9am on 2/16. Online and phone bidding will be available until 2/18/24. As we progress in the year, management is phasing out manual bids with the exception of emergency issues.
