



IMPACT UPDATE Regional Meeting December 21, 2017

IMPACT REDUCED BY 55

Representatives of Local 308 and its Regional Director, Brother Eugene Horton met telephonically with District and Area representatives of the Postal Service as a follow-up to the meeting of December 14, 2017 regarding the proposed impact to the Philadelphia NDC. Once again, present for the Union were Branch President Joe Zelenenki, Vice President Chris Lee and the undersigned. As previously reported, the employer has proposed to impact the craft by separating all Mail Handler Assistants and involuntarily reassigning 66 career Mail Handlers outside of the installation.

As stated, today's meeting was a follow-up to the meeting of December 14th that, as we reported last week, went a little sideways not long after beginning. At the earlier meeting the employer agreed to "re-crunch" their numbers and has shared those calculations with the Union. We are pleased to inform you that the impact, as it stands today, has been reduced from 66 to 11. Further, in the Union's view there is a reasonable expectation that it will be further reduced in the coming weeks and months. Our obvious goal is to eliminate the impact to all bargaining unit mail handlers and retain every career and career path mail handler at the NDC.
