



IMPACT UPDATE Regional Meeting January 22, 2018

IMPACT OFFICIALLY REDUCED TO 16 Custodian Positions To Be Offered

Representatives of Local 308 and its Regional Director, Brother Eugene Horton met telephonically with District and Area representatives of the Postal Service as a follow-up to the meeting of December 14, 2017. Today's meeting involved the proposed impact to the Philadelphia P&DC and reassignment opportunities into the custodian craft. Once again, present for Local 308 were Branch President Michael Rembelinsky and the undersigned. As initially announced, the employer had proposed to impact the craft by separating all Mail Handler Assistants and involuntarily reassigning 66 career Mail Handlers outside of the installation.

The impact was officially reduced to 16 today with our obvious goal to eliminate the impact to all bargaining unit mail handlers and retain every career and career path mail handler at the P&DC.

The employer has now notified the Union that they will offer 10 custodial positions to those career mail handlers who are interested within the installation. This will be open to all career mail handlers, even those who are outside of the current impact range. The rules for this type of cross-craft assignment are complicated and those interested in making this move should consider it very carefully before committing. For example, moving into another craft will start a new period of seniority upon the date of reassignment, which has been set at February 17, 2018. Notices and preference sheets are expected to be mailed to your address of record and hand delivered by local management in the coming days.
